

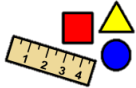

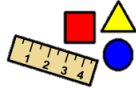

Maths

In Maths we will be learning about length, area and perimeter. We will also continue our learning on multiplication and division by looking at formal methods. Children will then begin their learning on fractions, recapping what fractions are, what the numbers in a fraction mean and will begin looking at mixed fractions.

English

This six-week unit of work immerses children in the story of C. S. Lewis's *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe*. They will use the text to develop their reading comprehension, vocabulary and writing. The unit culminates in a final piece of work where the children apply all that they have learned in this story to create a non-chronological report to inform and guide a visitor to Narnia.



Art

Children will develop skills in **printmaking** by using **polystyrene** tiles and paint. Children will look at artists such as Walter Anderson and Paul Carney.

Science

Children will explore teeth and digestion, developing the understanding that all parts of the body need food for energy, growth and repair. Children will understand the purpose of the digestive system and how it breaks down our food.

PE

This term, children will engage in lessons around gymnastics and dodgeball, developing fundamental movement skills of dodging, balance and throwing.

French

In French, children will recap general classroom language whilst learning how to say what I and others do.

Computing

In Computing, we will be using programming to create patterns using loops and create letters and shapes.

Music

Children will learn that Samba is a South American music style that is always performed with lots of percussion instruments where every member of the ensemble has a specific role.

RE

Children will be introduced to Hindu Dharma. Children are taught to act as philosophers, considering how Hindus might see the world. They will look at the concepts of Brahman to build up understanding.

RSHE

During this unit, pupils will become more digitally literate, analysing content and developing an understanding of how to check information and why someone may put false information online.

History

This unit is focused on what happened to Britain after the Romans left. Children will learn about the impact the Anglo-Saxons had on Britain and the formation of the United Kingdom.
